- **NO minimum requirements – you work as many or as few games as you want!**
- **This is a fundraiser in which family and friends can also be involved, making it more lucrative and more fun; plus you're outside in the summer!**

*****Please note that RCR may still run other fundraisers during the actual season in which our members participate to help offset the costs for WGI, raise money for equipment, etc.*****

Based on last year's assessment fee, you and two family members working on your behalf could have your assessment entirely paid off in about four games!!

River City Rhythm is proud to offer a way for anyone who wishes to participate in RCR to be able to work off their assessment fee over the summer before the season begins!

RCR will be partnering with Donations for Education to work at concession stands during any Twins home games. The money earned at each game will then be applied toward a member's assessment fee for the coming season.

The great thing is there is NO minimum requirements – no minimum number of games, no minimum number of workers. You can work a game by yourself, or you can find a date that works for several of your friends to help!

If you worked approximately 10 games between now and October (the end of the Twins' regular season) – *you would be able to march RCR for free!*



What is the first step?

Anyone who is interested in participating – even if it's for one game – must complete a training session hosted by the organization sponsoring the vendor booths at Target Field. Dates will be announced as they are available. Most dates occur in April.

Do I get to choose which games I can work?

YES! So if there are certain dates that work better (or certain teams you'd rather see), you simply sign up for those games. If you sign up for a game, you are GUARANTEED to work – there is no first come/first serve rule!



Can I ask others to work with me?

YES! Anyone can participate – whether it's the actual member of RCR or their friends or family. So if the member brings along two family members to also help work toward their assessment, then for that one game they will earn triple what the member would have!

How much do I make per game?

You are guaranteed no less than \$60 per person per game. However, the more sales that come in, the higher that goes – and with the Twins expecting larger crowds this year, you could make \$70 or more – the number is determined by the total sales of concessions for the game. **Most of the games are in April and May – be sure to get your training to start taking advantage!!**

How long do I have to work?

Workers usually need to arrive about 3 hours before the start of the game to do preparations and then work through the duration of the game – so about six hours of work total.

What if I'm not sure I'll march yet?

Any money earned during this fundraiser must remain with RCR by federal law. However, this money *can* be transferred to a sibling (but no one outside family). The worst thing that could happen is you raise the money and end up not marching, but then you've just donated to a non-profit. Is that a bad thing??

Are there any downsides or costs involved?

Unfortunately, there are three small – but easily workable – drawbacks:

- 1.# Anyone interested in working must be 18 years of age or older. However – this can be easily worked around by family or friends of younger members working on their behalf (after they attend a training session). This also makes it an excellent fundraiser for the college crowd interested in marching but concerned about the cost!**
- 2.# Parking is not free. However, there are some options. The parking ramps can range from \$7 - \$15 and these costs can be defrayed by carpoolers. There is also the option to park further away and take a train, light rail, or bus.**
- 3.# There is a one-time uniform cost, but it's only \$5.00 per person (for a hat). A shirt is provided, and you'll be required to wear black pants (no jeans).**

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
